### CRYPTOCURRENCY IN INDIA

Cryptocurrency is a digital currency in which transactions are verified and records maintained by a decentralized system using cryptography, rather than by a centralized authority. Buying cryptocurrency has always been a risk due to its volatile nature. Even in India there has been a lot of conversations on possible ban of cryptocurrency. Yet, here India stands on 1st position to have highest cryptocurrency owners in the world with a total of 10.7 crore crypto owners constituting 7% of the total Indian population. India is followed by the US (2.74 crore), Russia (1.74 crore) and Nigeria (1.30 crore). If we talk about percentage wise distribution of crypto owners around the world,

India ranks in 5th position. Ukraine ranked first with 12.73% people of the total population owning crypto followed by Russia (11.91%), Kenya (8.52%) and the US (8.31%). Most of the Indian audience use WazirX, CoinDCX, CoinSwitch Kuber

Even after many controversies revolving around ban on cryptocurrency in India, Indians did not stop from buying cryptocurrencies like Bitcoin, Ethereum. Indians are rigorously investing in cryptocurrencies like bitcoin, dogecoin, Ethereum, etc. This is quite astonishing as there was a lot of uncertainty going around its legal status. As mentioned earlier there were conversations going on banning cryptocurrency in India. Some of the reasons are that people may start investing in cryptocurrency instead of stocks or mutual funds. Security was another big reason. Due to all these speculations the government of India had proposed a bill on banning all private cryptocurrencies.

However, the bill was not tabled, and instead a committee was formed to provide suggestions on it. Since then, the government has softened its stance on cryptocurrencies and ban on cryptocurrencies as of now seems far.



## Super! Would you like to share your learnings from the win with the readers here?


