Legally speaking, what lies between crime and punishment, is a lot of grey areas. As many people operate under the mistaken assumption that law is black and white. That is to say, the law is enforced as it is written... Period. But, the law is not so black and white after all.

The main objective of punishment is to administer justice and there is no rule, or regulation that would answer the question of what is Justice as the term "Justice" is subjective in nature. The whole idea of justice revolves around what the judge considers just and reasonable as they are considered to be the supreme beings as provided with the stature of God himself (they are referred to as My Lord).

In order to administer justice, the judges use various theories of punishment ranging from retributive theory, preventive theory, and reformatory theory. But one theory should not be preferred over the other because "Every saint has a past and every sinner has a future."

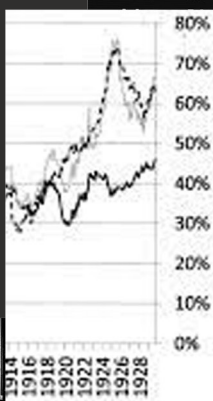
There exist extremes of punishment the first one being retributive in nature which is based on the principle of an eye for an eye, tooth for a tooth. The contention is that the object of this theory is to deter the crime but it fails to do so as we can observe that the death penalty

in the Nirbhaya case has not deterred the crime, as the rape cases are continuously being reported on a daily basis. Thus, this principle perpetuates the rule of the jungle as it cannot ensure the rule of law. The other extreme is, preventive in nature which aims to transform the criminal by restraining him from committing the crime. The restraint can be in the form of imprisonment which does not stop the crime but rather only postpones it.

"Let go of a hundred guilty rather than punish an innocent." This is the reason why there is a need for the judiciary to execute carefulness while administering justice or else the principles on which punishment is based would go for a toss. There lies a grey area in choosing the appropriate theory of punishment as a crime for one might be a last resort for the other.

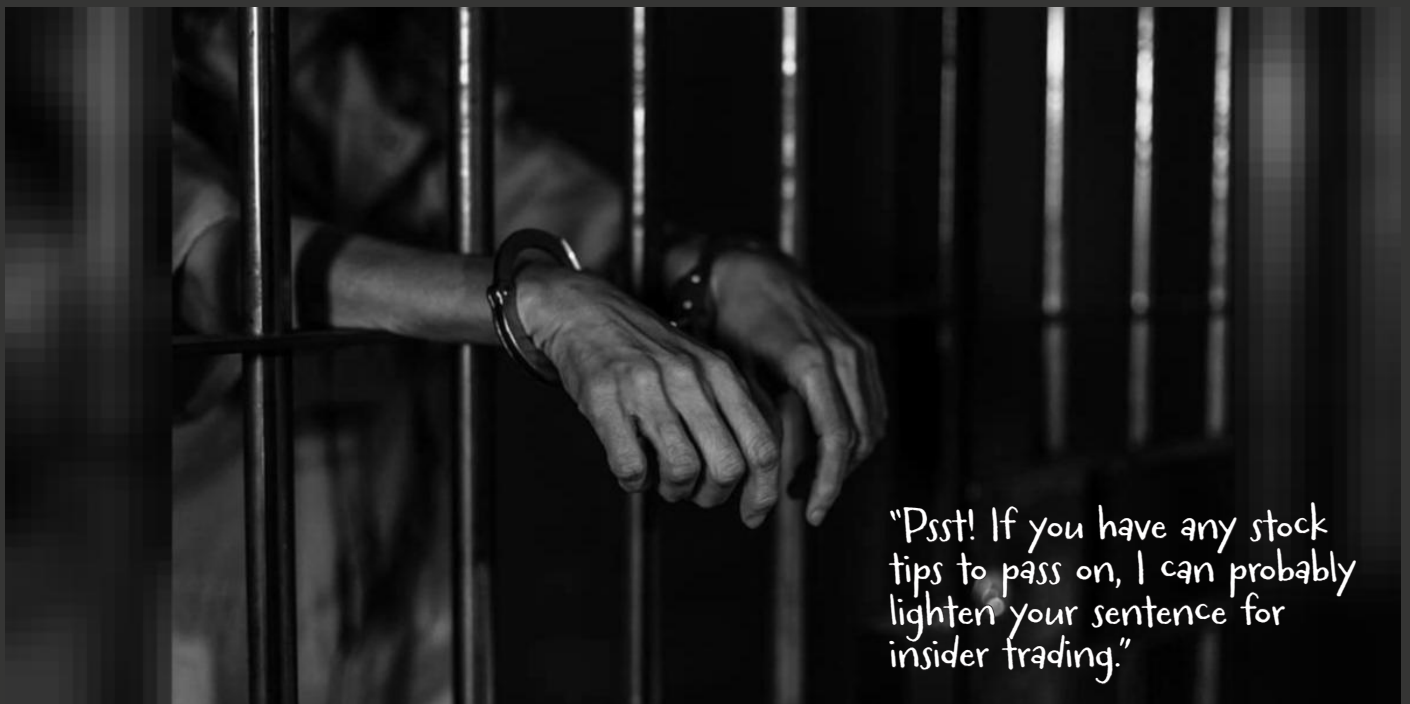


INSIDER TRADING THROUGH AN OUTSIDER'S PERSPECTIVE

When it comes to handling a profitable Business, Information becomes of vital importance. Every person or business functions based on the information it has. However, certain material knowledge is purposely hidden

from the eyes of the public to create an equal ground which if leaked among certain people, may cause a debacle. This is what the concept of Insider Trading is supposed to be based upon. Insider Trading refers to the practice of trading a company's

securities by an Individual with access to confidential or material non-public information about the company. It can be defined as an act of taking key trading decisions related to a company's listed stock using this material non-public information and gaining profits.

Insider Trading is currently illegal in India and deemed to be unethical by the Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) to promote fair trading in the stock exchanges for the benefit of the common Investor; however,

Arguments and Debates have been made by many marketing professionals and academicians which suggest contrasting opinions which do not conform to it either being ethical or unethical. Some are of the view that Insider

Trading has its benefits to Society and the Economy whereas some criticize the practice as being unfair and discouraging to Investors. Therefore, Let's look into Proponents for and against the Insider.

INSIDER TRADING

Proponents for Insider Trading

Insider Trading is highly questioned based on maybe Illegal but allowing non-public material information to be reflected in a Security or Stock's price would make the markets efficient as such reflection would convey the direction of the security's price to other Investors. Instead of depriving investors, it would increase the prospective investors to

buy the stocks at better prices while the current ones would be able to sell at better prices. Investors would trade based on the information provided which would not happen if information is not available earlier.

Barring the practice of Insider Trading may only delay the inevitable release of the non-public information gradually

to the public which may create errors in an investor's trading. The material information should be readily available as the security's price would be decided based on barring which would certainly lead to errors.

Critics against Insider Trading

The main point of contention revolving around Insider Trading is that a select few people may use this material non-public information for their advantage which raises an unfair and unethical image of the markets and questions its morality. This would lead to common investors undermining the validity of the financial system and may deem them rigged.

Investors without non-public material information would be robbed of the full value of their

securities by those Investors who have easy access to the material information which when integrated with the markets, would result in accurately priced securities.

Therefore, the bottom line is that Insider Trading regardless of it being Illegal and severely punishable has both its proponents and critics. It neither creates a balance nor tips to any other side.

GRAYS OF ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE



Prof. John McCarthy coined the term 'Artificial Intelligence' (AI) while working on a project on computer Chess during the 1950s. During his work, he coined the term 'Artificial Intelligence' to refer to the probability of creating a machine which could think, reason and process information like humans. To turn this to reality, human like intelligence needed to be implanted in a machine so that it can take decisions and improve itself by collecting the information fed to it. Fast forwarded to the 21st century, AI is on its way to become a part of almost every gadget involved in human lives. This intelligence, and the smart gadgets as a result of its continuous evolution are deeply embedded in our surroundings.

A research conducted in 2003 concluded that the internet traffic will double each year, meaning that AI equipped gadgets will cater to more human needs and eventually, will be exposed to even more information leading to an infinite loop which makes AI more better

and evasive. However, this new artificially intelligent realm does not come without its grays. Some of which are enumerated below.

Automation of tasks and additional involvement of AI into tasks which were previously manual will eliminate the need of people to handle them. Capitalist economies will resort to AI based operations and will cut down the costs they otherwise incur on an employee. The hazards posed by the problem of unemployment clubbed with growing population are disastrous for the world.

AI learns about its users and often personalizes its results from the data it collects from the inputs. This data intake is not limited to relevant and necessary information. The data collection process runs across domains such as images, voice, consuming patterns, location, duration of stay at particular locations and numerous other types of data. Research done by professors Steven M. Bellovin and Renee M. Hutchins made it clear that AI was able to predict a user's future exact location by collecting and studying his data. Now imagine this technology getting hacked and in hands of people whose motives are not very noble. A user, for instance, you would not

like your information to be stored by a machine that can be accessed by others. Would you like to live in a transparent house?

Another disadvantage of AI, however over exhibited by Sci-Fi comics and movies is that it may rule the world one day! Flippant as it may sound, but the statement is technically and logically true. The process of AI to self-improvise by learning the patterns from the data served to it and getting smarter through use is an infinite one. Facebook had to shut down two of its robots after they surpassed English and created their own language to converse and communicate in. AI is also used to self-encrypt and decrypt data. 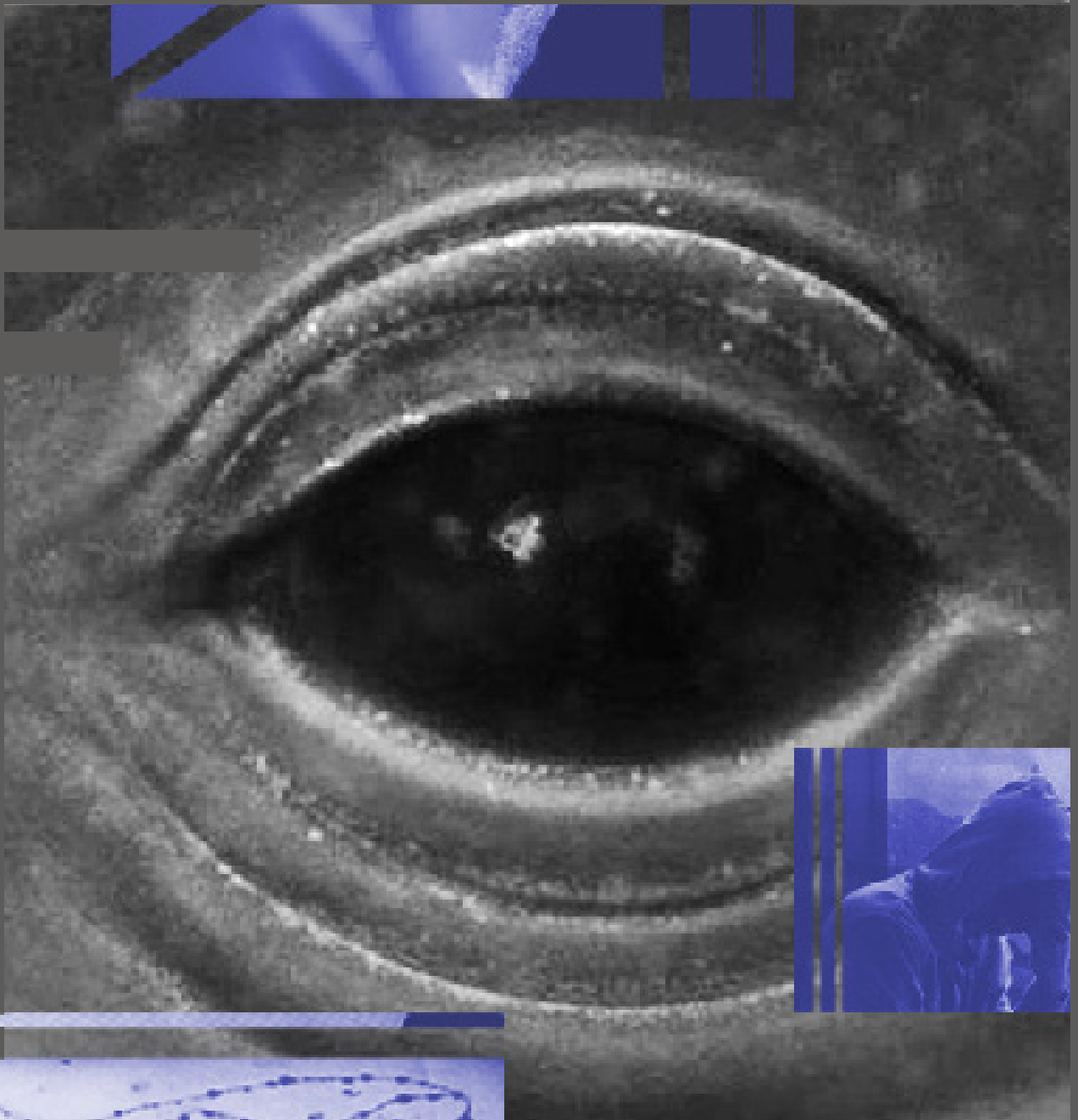
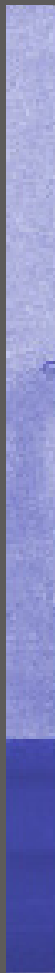

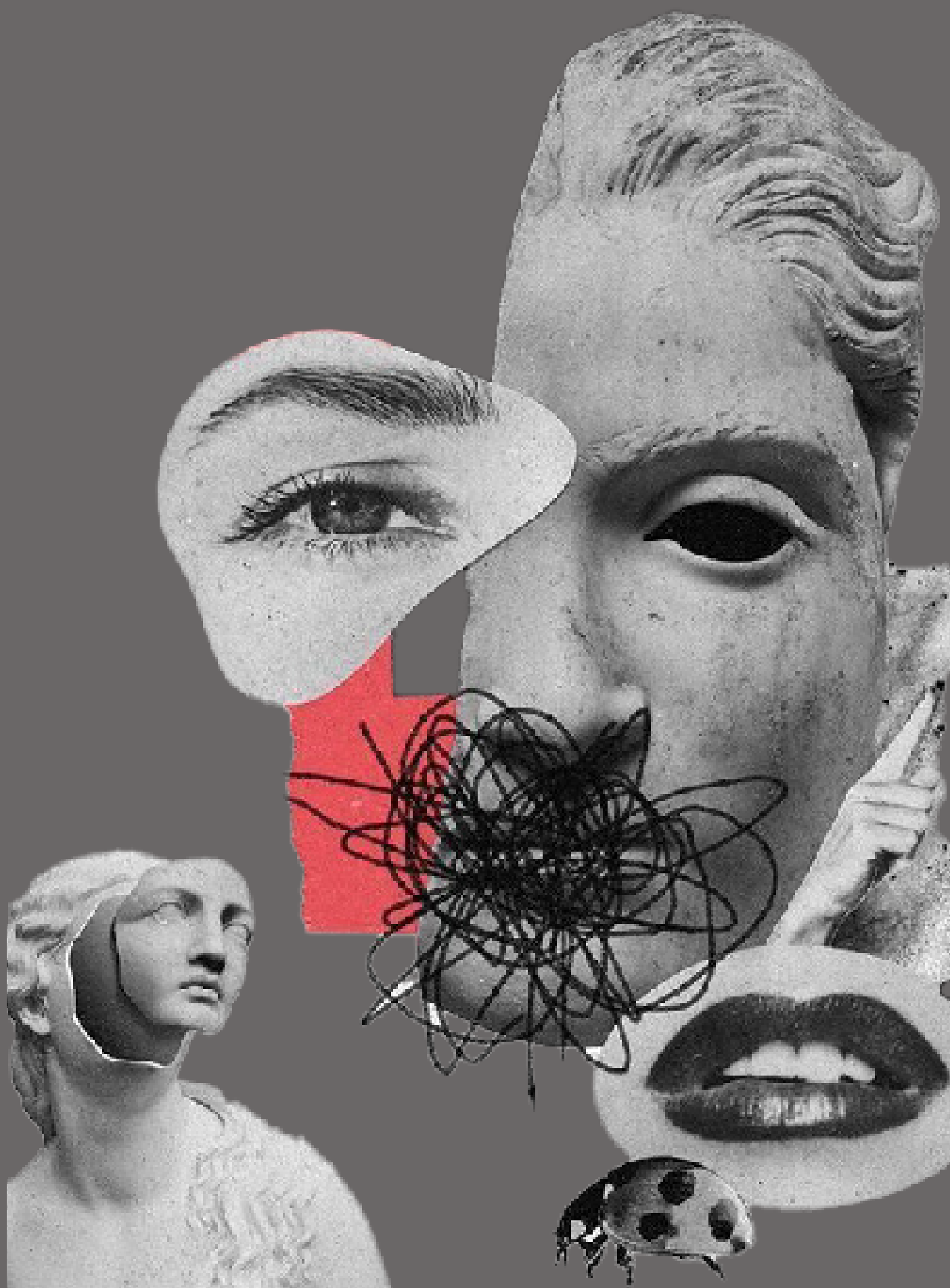
thinking about death are some of their challenges. To commit suicide is the final challenge in the "game."

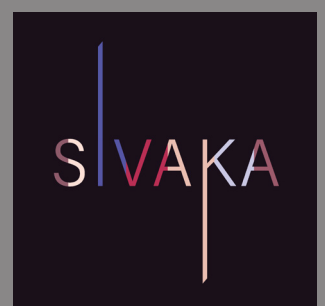

HAAFIZA

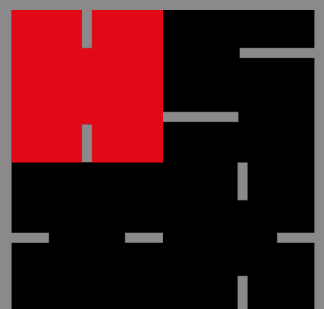

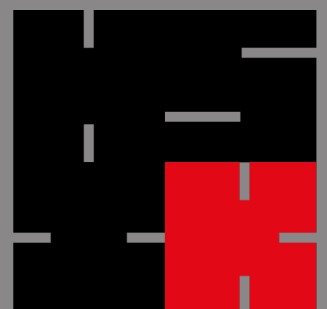




KALAMKUSH

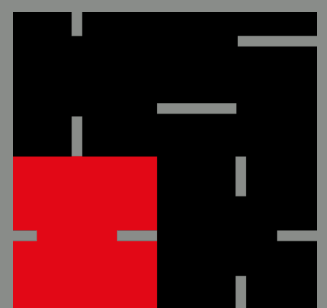
The Dance Mantra Academy conducted a workshop at Karnavati University on 27th

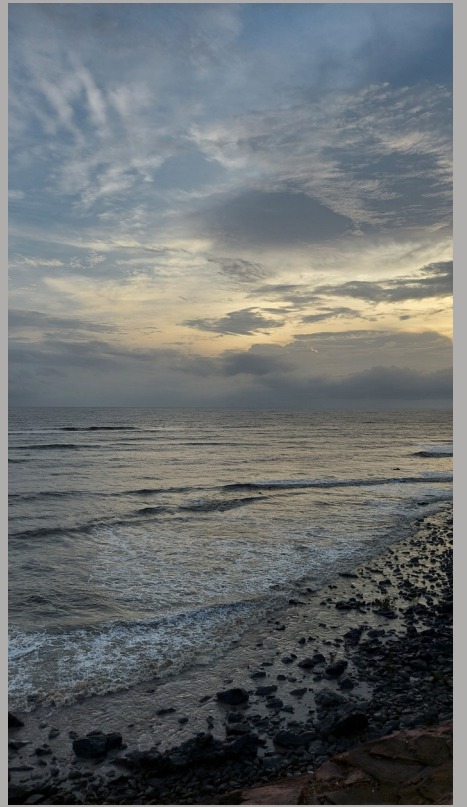
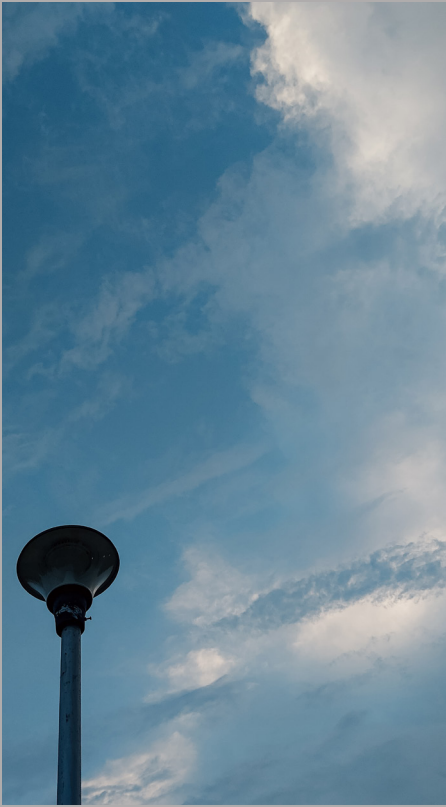
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
