Karnavati University has been accorded the status of a private university under Gujarat Private University Act, 2009 in March 2017, ratified by the State Government of Gujarat through official gazette no VOL.LVIII dated 28.03.2017 and signed by the Governor of Gujarat and later notified vide Education Department, Government of Gujarat's notification no. GH/SH/12/EPU/2017/10/KH1 dated 31.03.2017. It is empowered to confer degrees under Section 22 of UGC Act 1956.

Since its inception, the university has rapidly grown into one of the region's premier institutions, offering a wide range of undergraduate, postgraduate, and doctoral programs across various disciplines. With Students over 20 different states of India and several foreign countries, Karnavati University is one of the most ethnically and culturally diverse Universities in the region. Karnavati University is emerging as a leading private University in the state of Gujarat, with more than 355 faculty members and over 7000 enrolled students.

Karnavati university participated in the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) rankings and got 37th Rank in the Dental category for 2022. Further cementing its reputation as a leading institution in the Nation.

### **1.3 CRITERIA WISE SUMMARY**

#### **Curricular Aspects**

Curricular Aspects

The period from 2019-20 to 2023-24 marked significant growth for Karnavati University, with key developments in curriculum design and delivery. This period saw the institution navigating the challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic and leveraging the opportunity to align our curriculum with the New Education Policy (NEP) 2020. In 2022, the university initiated the phased implementation of NEP-2020, which led to a comprehensive revision of syllabi across all programs.

Key achievements in this regard include:

Program Expansion and Sustainability:

In 2017, Karnavati University introduced 17 new programs, all of which have successfully sustained. As of now, the university offers 51 programs across its various schools.

Comprehensive Syllabus Revision:

The syllabi for all 51 programs were meticulously revised to stay abreast of academic advancements. The Choice-Based Credit System (CBCS) was implemented across the board, except in programs regulated by statutory bodies such as the Dental Council of India (DCI) and Bar Council of India (BCI).

Holistic Development Courses:

Personality development and soft skills courses were made mandatory for all students, with a strong emphasis on practical language courses. These initiatives were designed to enhance employability and professional competencies.

Integration of Online Learning:

Students were actively encouraged to enroll in online courses offered through platforms like SWAYAM, NPTEL, and Coursera, promoting lifelong learning and exposure to global standards.

Focused Curriculum Design:

More than 95% of the courses were designed to strengthen core competencies, employability, entrepreneurship, and skill development. Academic flexibility was expanded through the introduction of interdisciplinary courses, accounting for approximately 47% of the offerings.

Value-Added and Cross-Cutting Courses:

Courses addressing important themes such as Ethics, Gender Sensitivity, and Environment & Sustainability were made mandatory. Additionally, 190 value-added courses were conducted, benefiting over 69% of the student body.

Research and Practical Exposure:

Research-oriented projects were made compulsory for all technical programs, including the Institute of Technology (Computer Science) and B.Design. These projects ensure hands-on learning and practical exposure for students. Furthermore, industry internships were mandated for all relevant degree programs/courses.

Co-Curricular and Extracurricular Activities:

The university placed a strong emphasis on co-curricular and extracurricular activities, encouraging students to participate in a variety of activities through dedicated clubs. In the 2022-23 academic year, over 90% of students engaged in field visits, industrial visits, research projects, or internships.

Stakeholder Feedback for Continuous Improvement:

Feedback from various stakeholders, including students, faculty, and industry representatives, was systematically collected, analyzed, and used to refine syllabi and improve academic processes. This ensures continuous curriculum improvement by incorporating inputs from students, faculty, alumni, and industry experts. This data-driven approach helps keep the curriculum dynamic, industry-relevant, and aligned with emerging academic and professional trends. It enhances student satisfaction, employability, and the overall learning experience, while promoting transparency and responsiveness to societal needs.

#### **Teaching-Learning and Evaluation**

Karnavati University has emphasized the delivery of curriculum that aligns with the broader societal objectives of education. Our focus is on experiential and skill-based learning, equipping students with the necessary competencies to become successful professionals and responsible contributors to society.

In fostering inclusivity, Karnavati University adheres strictly to the reservation policies as per the Government of Gujarat's guidelines. We take pride in attracting students from various parts of Gujarat, across India, and from international backgrounds. Over the past five years, we have maintained an impressive average demand ratio of 204:1, reflecting the high demand for our academic programs.

To support our students holistically, faculty mentors are assigned to small groups, with the mentoring process outlined during the orientation program. Our qualified faculty members are integral to the university's growth and success. The current student-to-full-time teacher ratio stands at 16:1, ensuring personalized attention and mentorship. Karnavati University adopts student-centric teaching methods, incorporating real-world applications into the curriculum. A structured approach is followed to classify, slow learners, regular learners and advanced learners, enabling tailored support for each student's learning journey.

We leverage modern technology to enhance the teaching-learning experience. ICT-enabled classrooms, an inhouse Learning Management System (LMS), and extensive use of digital tools provide students with enriched learning environments. Our faculty strength of 355 includes 51.87% PhD/MDS holders, and the average teaching experience among faculty members is 9.38 years.

The evaluation process at Karnavati University is transparent, objective, and largely digitized. Over the last five years, the average rate of student grievances was just **0.17%**. Examination results are typically declared within 15 days of the final exam date, and in the 2023-24 academic session, our pass percentage reached 94.28%.

We follow an outcome-based teaching-learning approach, regularly evaluating and analyzing course and program outcomes to ensure continuous improvement. Corrective actions are implemented as needed. Student satisfaction surveys play a pivotal role in assessing the quality of our teaching-learning processes, and the feedback received is instrumental in introducing innovative pedagogical practices.

- Green Campus: The campus is home to several green initiatives, such as an Herbal Garden, Ban on use of Plastics, landscaping with trees and plants, promoting biodiversity and sustainability.
- **Pedestrian-Friendly Environment**: The use of **battery-powered vehicles** and the restricted entry of automobiles create a safer and more pedestrian-friendly campus.
- **Rainwater Harvesting**: Sustainable water management is achieved through rainwater harvesting systems, reducing dependence on groundwater.

#### 3. Waste Management

KU has implemented a robust waste management system:

- **Biomedical Waste**: Handled in collaboration with **Pollu Care Biomedical Management Pvt. Ltd.** The waste are collected from various laboratories in different color coded bins and are disposed with the help of above agency, ensuring safe and compliant disposal.
- E-Waste Management: An MoU was signed with Evergreen e-waste Management Pvt. Ltd. to ensure proper disposal and recycling of electronic waste, further contributing to responsible environmental practices.

Awareness Drives and Information Dissemination: ELCs conduct awareness drives to educate students about the importance of registering as voters and the procedures involved. Information is disseminated through workshops, posters, social media campaigns, and classroom announcements, encouraging students to participate actively in the democratic process. Integration into Orientation Programs: The university has integrated voter registration as a key component of student orientation and induction programs. Newly admitted students are informed about their voting rights and encouraged to register during the initial

weeks of the academic year. Online Registration Assistance: To facilitate convenient voter registration, ELCs provide guidance and support for online registration through the National Voters' Services Portal. Trained volunteers help students navigate the online process, ensuring they complete their registration accurately. Partnerships with Local Election Offices: The university collaborates closely with local election offices to streamline the registration process for students and address any challenges they may face. These partnerships enhance the efficiency and effectiveness of the registration drives. Through these initiatives, the university is actively working towards minimizing the number of unregistered eligible student voters, fostering a culture of electoral participation, and ensuring that all students have the opportunity to exercise their democratic rights.

The University offers multidisciplinary courses that aim to create professionals competent in clinical, workplace, employability and communication skills. Academic activities focus on the objectives of knowledge enhancement, skill development and training for entrepreneurship.

The Dental -college through Competency-Based Medical Education (CBME) program integrates handson training with skill development, providing students with valuable opportunities to acquire and master essential competencies in dental practice.

The teaching hospital with a spectrum of clinical environment for patients provide an arena for competency and employability. The internship component in most programmes focusing on employment also provides an opportunity for guided field work experience. The Dental curriculum also has a structured competency framework to impart skill-based training.

Introduction of CBCS system and NEP guidelines for other programs such as design, management, law, computational science and liberal arts respectively also provides flexibility for learners to opt for ability enhancement course (AEC) and skill enhancement courses (SEC) that can help enhance their employability and allow them to manage their careers better.

Introducing PG diploma programs in naturopathy and Yoga Sciences is in line with the National Education Policy which aims at multidisciplinary programs with a Indian value based education.

Value-added courses are also being offered by various departments to cover additional areas of importance or relevance, enhance latest skill and value in design, law, management, computation intelligence, liberal arts, pharmacy, and dentistry. These courses help supplement the curriculum and make students better prepared to meet industry demands as well as develop their own interests and aptitudes. These courses are conducted by professionals and industry experts and help students differentiate themselves from the rest in the job market by adding further value to their resume.

The University has MOUs with national and international universities, institutions and industries to promote competency building, research, exchange of students and faculty members in specialized areas and provide internships which help in enhancing employability skills. The University has MOU with academic institutions to enrich academic experience for students with guest lectures from experts in this institution. The University also has MOU regarding student exchange programme where the students of respective universities attend classes with our students there by bringing in diversity amongst cohorts and sharing their experiences. The University also has various community outreach partnerships whereby students and faculty setup outreach health camps for specialized populations and gain real life exposure.

The Karnavati University has integrated in its curriculum various crosscutting issues relevant to health sciences like gender, environment and sustainability, human values, health determinants, right to health issues, emerging demographic changes and professional ethics.

All undergraduate students in first year are oriented towards human values, right to health and health determinants through different modes such as lectures, role plays etc. The curriculum has various interdisciplinary lectures focusing on gender issues, environment protection and sustainability and

professional ethics. Students are also sensitized towards gender issues through lectures, videos and short films.

Students are also made aware of the different committees of the University during their induction programme. The constitution and functions of these committees are displayed in the University office as well as various college, hospital and hostel premises.

Both undergraduate and postgraduate students are also oriented towards environment protection, conservation, determinants of health and professional ethics during their program and during internship through special training sessions.

Some of these sessions were specifically designed to address issues emerging out of COVID 19 pandemic. A team was identified by the University to impart training on "Infection Prevention and Control" to all the students, and staff of the Karnavati University. All students were also trained in environment protection and health determinants through the infection control practices.

The University organized offline training workshops and sessions on CPR and emergency medical care through learning and development (L& D) department at KU. The workshop was attended by undergraduate and postgraduate students as well as faculty members. The University also ensures all health care workers and staff are trained regularly in biomedical waste management, infection control, donning and doffing, hand wash and sanitization.

All days of national importance like World Population Day, World Environment Day, International Yoga Day are observed through a plethora of activities like CME, community awareness sessions and camps, tree plantation drives, poster competitions, role plays etc. National Constitution Day is also observed by the University to inculcate human values in all its students and sensitize them towards their responsibility towards the nation.

Professional ethics, including basic principles of autonomy, beneficence, non-maleficence and justice are conveyed to the students through lectures as well as workshops and seminars. Students are encouraged to participate in various national & international webinars.

Research methodology for PG and Ph.D. students focuses on sensitizing them on plagiarism, human values, research ethics, protocols for taking consent from patients for research.

As per the guidelines of UGC, a Women Welfare Cell has been established at the University to uphold the dignity of women. The foremost objective of this cell is to safeguard the self-esteem and rights of women students and employees as well as empowering them to take part in all the activities of the University.

Lectures and workshops are organized for awareness on women empowerment and entitlement of constitutional legal rights of women. Various sessions and webinars have been conducted to sensitize about rights and responsibilities of Indian citizens and legislation related to women empowerment and gender equity.

# **2.3.3** - Teachers use ICT-enabled tools for effective teaching and learning process, including online e-resources

ICT-enabled tools are used in teaching - learning process for both undergraduate and postgraduate students across all disciplines. All our classrooms are enabled with ICT including LCD, Desktops /Laptops, and Smart boards. Lecture Capturing System (LCS) is also enabled in seminar halls. Faculty were provided with the required training support to effectively use ICT-enabled tools including to create their own video content.

**LMS (Google class room), Video and tele-conferencing** is another modality, the use of which has been maximized during the present pandemic and with the University closed for on-campus classes, teaching was not hampered and all of the above-mentioned ICT tools were put to their best use.

Online and video lectures replaced classroom teaching. Seminars, journal clubs, guest lectures are also organized online for interactive learning using tools such as **Google meet, Microsoft teams, Zoom, WebEx.** 

Special sessions on faculty development are organized on virtual platform. Many webinars were also

organized by different departments in collaboration with national and international bodies especially on strategies to tackle COVID pandemic.

**ICT-enabled tools** are incorporated for admission process by conducting online entrance examinations and interviews. These exams assess candidates' aptitude and subject knowledge through a secure, proctored platform that ensures integrity. The online format allows for broad accessibility, enabling candidates to participate from any location.

Students are encouraged to create and maintain e-portfolios that document their academic progress, projects, and achievements. The **Career Service Department (CSD) manages digital portfolios** for students, showcasing their academic journey, skills, and achievements. These E-portfolios serve as a valuable tool for students to demonstrate their competencies to potential employers, enhancing their employability and career prospects.

The Karnavati University organized Ahmedabad design week (ADW) on involving participation of all departments with more than 4000 student registrations. E poster presentations, online skill demonstrations, workshops with interactive sessions were included and the proceedings were shared on social media.

**Library is also ICT enabled** and has an array of e books and e journals. Soft copies of thesis are also maintained in CDs and pen drive. Digital library with multimedia facility for UG/PG faculty with archives of CD and DVD are available in the library. The University also encourages to use the SWAYAM portal to enhance the teaching-learning process.

A comprehensive ERP system is used to streamline administrative and academic processes. This system integrates functions like student registration, attendance, grading, and finance management, ensuring efficient operations. It provides real-time access to data for students, faculty, and staff, enhancing overall productivity and decision-making.

**KEKA is used as HRMS platform**, to streamline HR processes, including employee management, payroll, attendance, and performance reviews, enhancing efficiency and transparency for both HR teams and employees.

Manuscripts for publications are routinely submitted online to the research school which are scanned using **Turnitin for plagiarism**.

Hospital information system (HIS) is installed in the teaching hospital to maintain electronic patient records which may be used later for research work.

Virtual surveillance through CCTV is regularly conducted and have become an integral part of the Karnavati University.

# **RESPONSE:**

Assessments plays a crucial role in determining educational quality and outcomes. Examination Department is always trying to evolve and improve on evaluation techniques to ensure that they correspond with Outcome-Based Education (OBE). The examination department maintains complete transparency by displaying examination manual containing SOPs, Rules & Regulations, etc. The department also ensures timely conduction of examination & display of results to ensure hassle free environment for student's progression. The examination halls are equipped with CCTV networks that connect to the central processing system and can thus be easily monitored from the COE office. Hence, conduction of Examinations is very well maintained and scrutinized.

Continuous improvement in assessment of both Internal & External process is evolved in order to ensure holistic development of the students. Some of the assessment process are as per the New Education system like Continuous Assessment (CA), Formative Assessment, Skill Development, Project based Evaluation, Experiential assessment etc.

As the examination department is well versed with latest technology, hence separate portals has been created for students, teachers, parents and admins to monitor it smoothly with minimum error and turnaround time for any queries and is mostly paperless in form. Faculties can use the dedicated portal to enter Internal Assessment marks / attendance and Assignment. Parents are also provided with the access to view their wards attendance in order to ensure timely intervention as 75% attendance is mandatory for appearing the End Semester Examination. Students' online portal facilitates them with all sorts of facilities like applying for examinations, transcripts, re-totalling/re-evaluation, pay fees, view examination timetables; download end-of-semester examination hall tickets, view internal assessment marks, etc. This leads to effective, user-friendly and transparent system of assessment.

The office of the Controller of Examinations is electronically automated using university customized ERP which has provision of continuous development. In addition, Controller of Examinations have the access to monitor examination halls, which are well equipped with the CCTV for continuous surveillance.

The overall students' assessment system is designed to test the higher order thinking skills and thereby promoting the creativity and innovation amongst the students.

The Dental council of India (DCI) attributes as per norms fulfil attributes of a locally competent and globally responsive clinician, a leader and member of a multidisciplinary healthcare team, effective communication or committed to lifelong learning and is altruistic, ethical and committed to excellence.

Dental graduates demonstrate in-depth knowledge and standards of dental practice while exhibiting academic and professional integrity with leadership skills.

Every course of the programmes has well-defined learning outcomes and competencies to be attained by the learners to meet the programme outcomes (PO) as recommended by the regulatory bodies. Outcomes are assessed using structured theory examinations which consist of MCQs, short and long essays. Each

learning outcome is assessed during continuous/formative as well as summative assessments.

#### **Formative Assessment:**

Faculty members prepare the lesson plans with learning outcomes, which are mapped with course outcomes. Learning outcomes are discussed with the students in each class and the outcomes achieved are assessed through formative assessments.

Formative assessment is designed at the University to continually assess medical knowledge, procedural & academic skills, interpersonal skills, professionalism, self directed learning and ability to practice amongst the students.

Internal assessment is frequent, covers all domains of learning and is used to provide feedback to students to improve their learning. It also covers professionalism and communication skills.

**3.1.1** The institution Research facilities are frequently updated and there is well defined policy for promotion of research which is uploaded on the institutional website. (500words)

The Karnavati University has a well-defined and documented Research policy, Standard Operating Procedures (SoP) for Research and promotion of research by the students and faculty alike. Adequate infrastructure facilities and conductive environment for promotion of research are in existence and such facilities including equipment's, consumables and facilities have been provided to facilitate research at the constituent colleges. A separate school, the Karnavati school of Research (KSR) is been established with Director-Research and supporting staff has been appointed to oversee the research activities and promote research related activities.

The Karnavati University has emphasized the need for promoting the innovation and research mind among faculty and students. Periodic trainings are provided to the Faculty about Research Methodology and integrity of research and quality outcomes of research. Our faculty are encouraged for approach the external funding agencies and government agencies for attracting research funds through external funding agencies.

The Karnavati University ensures timely allocation of funds for research projects, providing seed money and continual monitoring of the status of research projects as appropriate. The institution also facilitates and promotes interdisciplinary research projects and has established collaborations with other institutions at national and international level. The University provides institutional financial support both for conducting research and also its publications in indexed and high impact journals.

Researchers of eminence are invited regularly to train our faculty and students about the Qualitative and Quantitative Research advancement happening worldwide apart from the use of such research innovations and outcomes serving the cause of the society in Health and Management. Thus, sustained stimulus is provided continually for promoting research initiatives and avenues ideas and to explore a new avenue for establishing research collaborations. At university level we have URC (university research committee) and then at Institution level, we have Department research committee (DRC) to monitor and promote research outcomes at the KU level.

Thesis Advisory committee (TAC) is established for every Ph.D. research student which oversees all their research activities. This committee comprises of Research guide, co guides and external experts. The university has constituted a Research Award selection committee which approves the awards for research among the research scholars. All thesis of Ph.D scholars are uploaded at e-Shodhganga platform.

# **Promotion of Research**

The research policy of the Karnavati University aims to create and support a research culture among its faculty and students and for enriching and enhancing the professional competencies of the faculty and students. This has led to promotion of scientific temper and research attitudes of all learners leading to the achievement of the Research Objectives of the Institution.

With the intent of sensitizing and empowering the members of the faculty and students with competencies required to conduct high quality research, to innovate and to generate intellectual property rights, various capacity building programs are periodically organized by the Karnavati University and its constituent colleges. (https://link need to mentioned/) These programs are designed to suit the understanding capacity of the target audience. A brief summary of such programs is given below.

1. **Intellectual Property Rights**: The Karnavati school of Research, IQAC as well as Institution's Innovation Council of the Karnavati University lead from the forefront in organizing sensitization programs, workshops and seminars on various aspects of IPR. The impact of these programs is reflected in the steady increase in the number of patents, copyrights and design applications published and granted between 2020- 2024.

2. **Research Methodology**: Workshops on Research methodology, Research Ethics, Scientific Literature Search techniques and Biostatistics are organized in all faculty members of the Karnavati University. Many workshops have been conducted in the last five years and these workshops were well received by the Post Graduates, Research Scholars and Faculty members. With the intention of inculcating research aptitude in the minds of young graduates, such programs have been initiated for undergraduate students as well.

**3. Scientific Writing:** The art of scientific writing, is an essential skill needed to be a successful researcher. Hence, seminars and workshops on research grant writing, and manuscript writing are conducted to enable students and staff to get a grip on scientific writing which has led to a gradual increase in the number of research papers published and government projects sanctioned. Proposal writing, dissertation/thesis writing and synopsis writing were dealt in detail, during the PG orientation programs as well as in the course work of PhD scholars, to enable them to pen down these scientific documents in a precise manner.

**4. Good Clinical Practice (GCP):** Continuing medical education on GCP, Good laboratory practice and good pharmacy collection practices are regularly conducted by pertinent departments for the benefit of researchers in the Karnavati University, to instil the importance of Good Research practice. Special internship programs were conducted by the Karnavati University to train the students on laboratory practices. Students from the University well as other institutions were benefited through these training programs.

5. **Industry Academia Collaborations**: An important prerequisite to catalyse innovation and cultivate entrepreneurial skills among students is to have Industry Academia Collaborations. The Karnavati University has partnered with various industries and institutes to bridge the gap between industrial and academic needs. Additionally, the University has signed several Memorandum of Understanding with industries and institutions. All these initiatives have enabled to create an ecosystem that fosters research, innovation as well as entrepreneurship among students and staff of the University. The support of the

The Karnavati University has established documented policy and Procedures for providing consultancy services including revenue sharing methodology within the organization and to external institutions. The consultancy rules are flexible and accommodative to cater to the needs of the investigators and researchers. The policy takes into consideration the purpose of Consultancy services to be provided by the faculty and depending on the number of days/months the consultancy services have to be offered, the time and nature of consulting and off campus days the faculty has to spend, the monetary gains for the faculty and sharing of revenues, the permission is granted to the faculty to provide consulting service to external organizations.

These consulting services enable the faculty to improve their knowledge and skills apart from encourage them for research in their field of interests. However, the consulting provess and inhouse capabilities, skill of the faculty to be upgraded. To this end in view a continual educative series and seminars are planned in the current academic year for enabling improvement of the faculty and number of consultancy services provide.

Thus, consultancy service provision is not only a tool to share the knowledge, generate revenue but also to build strategic alliances for the socioeconomic and technological growth.

The product, process or service outcome of consultancy services provide better, permanent solutions to the problems in the domains of researchers and helps the people of the nation and also global community.

The MOU document includes the deliverables, milestones, Gantt charts, performance outcomes, payment schedules, role and responsibilities of the parties, non-disclosure of confidential information, disputes resolution, consequent liabilities in case of non-performance, IPR matters. # 6.1.2 - Effective leadership is reflected in various Institutional practices such as decentralization and participative management etc.

From the beginning, Karnavati University has adopted the strategy and implementation of decentralisation and empowerment of academic and administrative tasks to provide efficient institutional governance. Various committees, boards, and councils, comprising all relevant stakeholders, have been successfully contributing to informed decision-making across different functions. The tasks and responsibilities of all office bearers and authority are established throughout the creation process in accordance with the rules supplied by the relevant regulatory agencies and universities' bylaws.

A few case studies that are suggestive of decentralization and participative management are presented here.

## Academic Council

The Academic Council, composed of Department Heads, representatives from the corporate sector and subject experts, considers suggestions given by all stakeholders and adopts them if found valid. The commencement of a new program or the review of existing programs, as well as other academic issues, are deliberated upon in the meetings of the Board of Studies. The Boards' resolution is submitted to the Academic Council for further approval and implementation.

## **Internal Quality Assurance Cell**

Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) cell of Karnavati University's was established on August 17, 2021, in accordance with the guidelines of the University Grants Commission (UGC) and based on the advice of the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC). The IQAC, as an integral component of the university education system, plays a crucial role in the ongoing process of improving and maintaining the quality of education. The main goal of IQAC is to guarantee the implementation of quality initiatives throughout the university and to carry out regular and ongoing reviews and audits in order to achieve academic excellence.

### Incubators and Startups at KU

Karnavati University has established two internal incubation facilities to promote innovation and entrepreneurial endeavours:

1. Karnavati Innovation & Incubation Foundation (KIIF) is a sector-agnostic incubation centre that provides support to entrepreneurs and innovation projects across several industries.

2. The Defence Design and Technology Incubator of India (DDTII) is a program focused on fostering the development and advancement of defense-related design and technology in India. Its goal is to stimulate and support the creation of new ideas, research, and advancements in the fields of defence, space, and related businesses.

Through these facilities, Karnavati University has implemented a participative management approach where all colleges can contribute and take advantage of these facilities.

## **Budgeting Process**

Each college within the University independently formulates its own budgets and seeks approval to spend funds as outlined in those budgets. This allows the member colleges to have financial independence. The finance officer consolidates the received budgets and assesses their practicality. The report prepared by the finance committee is then approved by the University's Board of Management. After receiving approval from the Board of Management, the recommendations are forwarded to the respective deans. Alongside, recommendations are also discussed with the procurement committee, which then requests quotations for the purchase of new equipment or supplies. Therefore, the duty for budgeting is distributed fairly and responsibly among all stakeholders, including faculty, department heads, deans, and the university, in a well-organised manner.

Karnavati University has a clearly defined organisational hierarchy and structure to support decision making process that is clear and consistent.

Karnavati University, a privately-owned institution, is dedicated to achieving high standards of education and promoting interdisciplinary studies. Located on a vast 33-acre campus in Uvarsad near Gandhinagar, it was founded in accordance with the Gujarat Private Universities Act, 2017. The university, authorised to provide degrees according to Section 22 of the UGC Act, places a strong emphasis on providing highquality education. It has been a member of the Association of Indian Universities since April 2019. Under the governance of the Karnavati Medical & Educational Trust, the university strives to transition from being versatile to becoming highly specialised. It offers a wide array of programs in design, arts, health, business, and humanities. The university has established all the necessary bodies, committees, and councils to facilitate the involvement of all stakeholders in the decision-making and execution processes.

The Vice Chancellor carries out academic administration and management by following the norms of statutory/non-statutory bodies. The university being a deemed university also has its own service rules, promotion policy, leave rules, welfare schemes, and grievance cell in place. In accordance with the rules of the university,

The statutory bodies, such as the Board of Management (BOM), Academic Council, Finance Committee, Boards of Studies (BOS), Planning and Monitoring Board, and Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), meet regularly with a predefined agenda. The resolutions and decisions from these meetings are documented, circulated, and implemented accordingly. To ensure transparency and compliance, nominees from the University Grants Commission (UGC) and the Government of India are present in all these bodies. Additionally, external members are included in various boards and committees to further enhance transparency in the system.

The Board of Management (BoM) is the principal executive authority of the university, overseeing the

administration, supervision, and implementation of various functions to achieve the university's objectives while upholding its core values.

**The Finance Committee** manages the university's financial planning and policies, including the approval of budgets presented by other boards and committees.

**The Planning and Monitoring Board** serves as the primary planning body, responsible for overseeing the development programs of the university.

**Board of Studies** for each department is tasked with preparing, revising, and updating the syllabi for different courses, which are then submitted to the Academic Council for approval and publication.

**The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)** of Karnavati University has been constituted on 17th August 2021 in compliance to the UGC's guideline and based on recommendation of the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC). Karnavati University is a self-financed institution that does not get any grants from the central or state governments to perform its operations. The university's primary source of funding is tuition fees and other fees like transport, library services, hostel fees, and activity fees received from students. The KU Dentistry college hospital generates additional money through patient care and consulting services. The hostels that provide student housing on campus generate revenue and are recorded in the hostel fee account.

Apart from this, rental income is generated from allotment of space for refreshments and Food containers located at three places on campus. These food areas provide easy and affordable access to instant food and beverages for students and staff. Similarly, space is rented out to set up a pharmacy shop outside the dental hospital is opened on the campus for optimal space resource mobilization.

### Effective utilization of resourses

Karnavati university effectively utilizes the funds in the following ways :

· Disbursal of staff salary

Karnavati University has implemented a comprehensive financial auditing mechanism that encompasses both internal and external audits to ensure accuracy, transparency, and compliance with statutory requirements. Over the past five years, the institution has adhered to a rigorous auditing process involving periodic evaluations by both internal and external auditors.

#### **Internal Audit Mechanism:**

Internal audits are a fundamental component of Karnavati University's financial oversight. The internal audit process begins with transaction processing within the Accounts Department, which acts as the first line of control. This process involves:

1. **Budget Provision:** Establishing budgetary allocations.

- 2. Purchase Requisition: Initiating purchase requisitions and obtaining necessary approvals.
- 3. **Documentation:** Providing support documentation for transactions.
- 4. Authorization: Securing required authorizations and approvals.
- 5. Vendor Management: Creating and managing vendor accounts.

All these procedures are meticulously reviewed before transactions are recorded in the accounting system.

The internal audits are conducted by Mr. Nirav Shah which meticulously examines all financial transactions, including payments, to ensure compliance and accuracy. Discrepancies identified during these audits are analysed, and corrective actions are suggested to address any issues. Internal audits are performed on a periodic basis, and detailed reports are submitted quarterly to both the external auditors and the university's management for review and necessary corrective measures.

The scope of the internal audit includes:

- Governance: Evaluating the effectiveness of governance structures.
- Risk Management: Assessing the risk management framework and its implementation.
- **Process Improvement:** Identifying areas for process enhancement.

The Internal Audit Committee at Karnavati University further ensures a comprehensive review by examining income sources, cash books, vouchers, stock registers, logbooks, statutory payments, and bank transactions. This committee also verifies all financial activities, whether directly or indirectly related to finance.

#### **External Audit Mechanism:**

External audits are a statutory requirement for all institutions, and Karnavati University engages an independent third-party auditor to fulfil this obligation. The external audit is conducted by Mr Amin Parikh & Company, Vadodara, Gujarat..a recognized and licensed audit firm. The process includes:

- 1. Audit of Financial Statements: Verifying the university's accounts in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards, statutory, tax, and regulatory compliances.
- 2. Annual Account Statements: Preparing annual financial statements and audit reports based on the university's records.
- 3. **Submission to Statutory Bodies:** Presenting the audited accounts to the university's management and submitting the final reports to the relevant statutory bodies.

The external audit follows a clearly defined procedure, ensuring compliance with state laws, university management rules, and best practices from both state and central government regulations. This includes a thorough verification of all financial transactions, statutory commitments, and timely filing of returns.

Throughout the external audit process, auditors discuss their observations and findings with the Finance team. Any additional information requested by auditors is promptly provided. The audit concludes with a final debriefing, where the audited accounts are signed off upon the auditors' satisfaction.

By integrating both internal and external audit mechanisms, Karnavati University ensures the accuracy and integrity of its financial reporting and maintains transparency in its financial operations.

The primary task of the IQAC is to develop a holistic system for conscious, consistent & catalytic improvement in the overall performance of the University. Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) at Karnavati University has significantly contributed in institutionalizing the quality assurance strategies and processes by constantly reviewing the teaching learning process, structures & methodologies of operations and learning outcomes at periodic intervals.

#### IQAC – Vision

IQAC at Karnavati University ensures to promote quality culture and consciousness as the primary characteristic of Karnavati University through collaboration, internationalization and institutionalization of best and unique practices with stakeholder supports.

The major functions of IQAC include preparing a calendar of events, identifying quality parameters for different types of activities and maintaining proceedings. IQAC is also responsible for evolving various mechanisms and procedures for efficient and effective functioning of various institutes, schools and departments of the university. This includes academics, research, administrative functions and overall operations.

The IQAC has contributed to several academic and curriculum changes and modifications in policies and

pedagogy. This includes setting up curriculum review at regular intervals, organizing expert committee visits to assess the performances of faculty across departments, increasing assignment-based evaluation methodology for curriculum adopted, strengthening of faculty through orientation programs and setting up a strong feedback system for various stakeholders. #### **Response:**

The Karnawati University lays a lot of emphasis on gender equity and the academic ambience of the University promotes sensitivity and respect for each other. The University shares certain values and principles on equality, inclusion, respect for human dignity, fairness and justice for all. As per the guidelines of UGC and the Supreme Court directions, a committee has been constituted for the prevention of sexual harassment against women at the university to uphold the dignity of women.

The university has gender equity policies in place that promote unbiased representations of all genders. This is supplemented with monitoring and evaluation mechanisms for implementation of policies and their follow-ups.

Our faculty and staff are regularly sensitized to set the standard for respectful behaviour at work. Every year, interactive sessions on women empowerment are organized for all students and employees to sensitize them about rights and responsibilities of Indian citizens and legislation related to women empowerment and gender equity. Topics related to women empowerment, gender equity, are covered by eminent personalities to create the awareness about gender equity.

Admission team of the University also ensures that there is no gender bias during student admissions. Similarly, our recruitment policy in all cadres including highest posts of administrative responsibility is based purely on merit with no gender bias whatsoever. As a result, the University have over 62% female students and over 60% of female teachers, 40% of non- teaching faculty and support staff and many of them have been associated with the University since its inception.

The University also believes in taking forward the momentum of empowerment of girls and women through education. The participation of women has increased in and higher education over the years and various measures have been taken to increase their participation in various activities at the University.

In all student committees, equal leadership opportunities are to be given to both girls and boys. The University strives to provide equitable platforms whether sports, cultural, literary & training programs to all the students to exhibit their talents and skills.

Personalized mentorship and counselling programs that give support and thrust towards progression to higher education and placement have also been implemented.

The University officials regularly orient the teachers to create gender inclusive learning environment where unbiased teaching and learning activities has been implemented for all students irrespective of their gender.

University has set up CCTV surveillance, biometrics and women security guards to monitor the

movement of students near the girl's hostel as well as throughout the campus.

For safety and security of students, special committees such as Anti-Sexual Harassment and Antiragging Committee are in place to monitor and prevent any type of harassment against female employees and students. However, no such cases of sexual harassment and gender-based discrimination have been reported so far which clearly reflects the effectiveness of our procedures.

As per recent norms of National Medical Commission, a childcare facility shall be established and this facility is helping the female employees to work comfortably, without worrying about their small children.

#### **Response:**

MAHER has standard processes and operations in place to manage the degradable and non-degradable wastes generated within the campus, to decrease the impact on the human health and environment. All the degradable and non-degradable waste are managed in compliance with the Environmental (Protection) Act 1986 and the local body regulations. The major categories of wastes generated in the campus are solid wastes, liquid wastes, biomedical wastes, e-wastes and chemical wastes.

**Solid waste** generated through the routine activity of the university includes paper, plastic, glass, food, etc. The university has taken initiatives to reduce the solid waste by adopting measures like plastic free campuses, The university has contracted vendors who collect all solid waste from different places at designated times and intervals in large color-coded garbage bags, segregate and recycle it and transported it to the large land fill authorized by the government for final disposal. All these processes comply with the Solid Waste Management Rules, 2016 with approval from concerned regulatory agencies.

**Biomedical waste** generated in the hospital is managed by SOPs set in accordance to the Bio-Medical Waste Management Rules, 2016. Specific colored bins are placed at all strategic places in the hospital, the wastes are segregated and stored in a central location which is a restricted area within the campus. The medical college has set up an MoU with a biomedical waste management vendor who picks up the waste once a day through a designated truck. A logbook of handing over waste is maintained as per the Regulations. Similarly, COVID waste disposal is also streamlined as per the government norms.

**Chemical waste** management is in place to safely manage the laboratory chemicals used by various departments. An inventory of laboratory chemicals is maintained at the department level which is centrally monitored by the Environmental Management Committee. The chemicals and liquid hazardous

wastes are stored in a central location which has restricted access and disposed according to government norms.

**E- waste** from the university, hospitals and hostel buildings is stored in a designated location until it is donated to deserving under-privileged section of society. University is also setting up MoU for management of e waste with vendor who will handle its recycling.

**Liquid waste** is at present disposed through STP plants in the medical and the dental campuses. Ian average quantity of 373 KLD of sewage is generated at the medical college campus which varies according to the student strength residing in the hostels. The effluent treatment plant comprises of the collection tank, aeration tank, settling tank, clarifier tank, pressure sand filter, activated carbon filter, ultrafiltration, single drying beds. In the other campuses it is through the sanitary distribution installed in the campuses. The waste water treatment system for handling the liquid wastes and making it suitable for reuse is in the pipeline.
